ORDER GRANTING INTERIM RELIEF

HIROSHI BABA, of 3529 Muirfield Road, Los Angeles 16, California, having filed a verified complaint alleging in substance that prior to June 15, 1966, complainant was a subscriber and user of telephone service furnished by defendant under number REpublic 5-6496; that on or about June 15, 1966, said telephone facility was removed and disconnected by law enforcement officers who caused complainant to be arrested on a charge of suspicion of bookmaking; that complainant is not a bookmaker; that he never used, and does not intend to use said telephone facility as an instrumentality to violate the law, or in aiding or abetting violation of the law; that complainant has made demand upon defendant for restoration of said telephone facility but said defendant has refused and does now still refuse to do so; that complainant is a barber and much of his business is by telephone appointment, and since this is his only means of livelihood he will be handicapped without his phone in his effort to maintain and support his family; that complainant seeks restoration of said telephone facility forthwith, and good cause appearing,

IT IS ORDERED that The Pacific Telephone and Telegraph Company, a corporation, is hereby directed to reconnect and restore telephone service to complainant and to maintain such service pending further Commission order herein, said service to be furnished pursuant to defendant's filed tariff rates and rules applicable thereto. The complaint will be set for hearing before such Commissioner or Examiner, and at such time and place, as may hereafter be designated.

The Secretary is directed as follows:

1. To cause a certified copy of this order, together with a copy of the complaint herein, to be personally served upon The Pacific Telephone and Telegraph Company, a corporation, and said defendant is directed to serve and file its reply within ten (10) days after said service.
2. To cause a copy of this order to be mailed to complainant.
3. To cause appropriate notice of hearing to be mailed to the parties at least ten (10) days prior to the hearing herein.
