O P I N I O N

Public hearings in these matters were held before Examiner Gagnon at San Francisco on March 16 and 17, 1966. Copies of the petition and the notice of hearing were served in accordance with the Commission's procedural rules. Petition No. 406 and

limited phases of the Commission's Orders Setting Hearings involved herein were submitted, subject to the receipt of late-filed exhibits which have since been received.<sup>1/</sup> Petition No. 406 is not opposed and various interested shippers appeared in support of certain aspects thereof. For the most part, interested shippers are not in agreement with the alternative proposals of the Commission's Transportation Division staff and strongly object to certain of the tariff revisions the staff recommends.

Petition No. 406 involves a request of the California Trucking Association (CTA) to amend various commodity descriptions for which exception ratings are provided in Minimum Rate Tariff No. 2. This is one of a series of proposals instituted by the CTA designed to make minimum rate tariff descriptions more definite and certain, and to provide a tariff format more compatible with pending and prospective innovations in electronic billing and rating techniques, involving both shipper and carrier operations. This tariff modernization program was commenced recently by petitioner as well as the Commission's staff and the program has progressed substantially (Decision No. 69994, in Case No. 5432, dated November 23, 1965).

The Commission's Transportation Division staff has been conducting various studies concerning the statewide transportation

of general commodities, subject to the provisions of Minimum Rate Tariff No. 2 and Exception Ratings Tariff No. 1, to determine the extent to which, if at all, these tariffs should be revised to reflect current transportation conditions.<sup>2/</sup> One phase of these studies involves relating the commodity descriptions in Minimum Rate Tariff No. 2 with those set forth in the governing National Motor Freight Classification. The minimum rate tariff includes a number of tariff items listing various commodities for which exceptions to the governing classification or exception ratings tariffs are provided. In addition, the minimum rate tariff also contains several commodity descriptions applicable in connection with specific commodity rates.

The overall objectives of the California Trucking Association and the Commission staff are, in the main, identical in that both seek to relate the commodity descriptions in Minimum Rate Tariff No. 2 directly with those set forth in the governing classification. The basic difference between the petitioner's and the staff's proposals is one of degree or emphasis rather than any fundamental difference in objectives.

Under the CTA proposal only certain of the commodity descriptions, for which exception ratings are provided in Minimum Rate Tariff No. 2, would be directly referenced to like commodity descriptions contained in the otherwise governing classification. The CTA would add to each of the existing commodity descriptions, contained in the various exception items of the minimum rate tariff, a reference to the governing classification item numbers which, in petitioner's judgment, also describe the same commodities for classification purposes. The petitioner explained that

areas of doubt as to whether a particular commodity description in the governing classification embraced a specific commodity, for which an exception rating was named in the minimum rate tariff, were resolved through consultation with the National Classification Board of the National Motor Freight Classification.

Minimum Rate Tariff No. 2 contains certain commodity descriptions covering tariff exceptions for which no analogous descriptions are provided in the governing classification. In such instances, the petitioner's proposal would have the minimum rate tariff make reference to all classification items which encompass the commodities known to be subject to the particular tariff exception involved. The resulting changes in descriptions suggested by petitioner are, therefore, intended to be only minor and have been made only when necessary to effectuate the desired major overall objective.

The Commission's staff would go further than petitioner's proposal when relating the commodity descriptions in Minimum Rate Tariff No. 2 with the corresponding descriptions set forth in the governing classification. The staff witness stated that the general purpose of his proposal was to restate, amend or revise the commodity descriptions named in Minimum Rate Tariff No. 2 so as to conform precisely with the like descriptions of the National Motor Freight Classification. The staff study is not limited to the existing exception provisions of the minimum rate tariff but also includes a complete restatement of the list of commodities presently contained in the tariff in connection with designated commodity rates.

The staff proposal, if adopted in its entirety, would have the effect of materially altering the scope of application

of certain exception provisions of the tariff. For example, Item 360 of Minimum Rate Tariff No. 2 currently provides exception ratings of fourth class, minimum weight 20,000 pounds, and fifth class, minimum weight 30,000 pounds, applicable to "Liquors, vinous". By Decision No. 59892, in Case No. 6342, dated April 5, 1960 (unreported), the Commission found that the above exception ratings, in addition to applying on certain shipments of wine, also applied to movements of brandy which originates from grapes. In its efforts to restate the tariff description covering the exception ratings for "Liquors, vinous" into the precise language of the governing classification, the staff excluded a reference to "brandy, when made from grapes", thereby making this commodity subject to the higher class ratings named in the classification. Such action, although recommended in lieu of the prior finding of the Commission (Decision No. 59892), is not supported by any factual staff study indicating that the current exception ratings for grape brandy are without merit and should be canceled. It being the general understanding of interested shippers that the proposals of the CTA and the staff were not to result in any significant increases in rates, they object to the staff's proposal to cancel outstanding exceptions to the governing classification in this proceeding. Since the record will support but minor technical increases in rates, the objections raised by shippers to certain aspects of the staff proposal are well taken. Substantive modifications in present exception provisions of Minimum Rate Tariff No. 2, such as cited above, have not been shown to be justified at this time and should not be adopted.

Complete classification descriptions, as proposed by the staff in connection with certain commodity group descriptions named

in the tariff, have not been shown to be required in all instances. This is especially true where the application of existing tariff commodity group descriptions is clear and certain and the sought restatement thereof in the precise language of the classification would entail substantial duplication of tariff matter already provided in the classification or exception ratings tariff.

Conversely, there is also little justification to generalize or otherwise deviate from the language of the classification when tariff exceptions thereto are rather simple and forthright, with little or no additional printed tariff matter required. The staff proposal in the latter area is proper and should be adopted.

Considerable testimony was also presented by petitioner and the staff relative to the most suitable method of referring to the items of the governing classification which embrace a given commodity description named in the tariff. The petitioner recommends that, after each commodity description named in the tariff, a parenthetical suffix be added which would condition the commodity description to being "(as described in Item...)" of the governing classification. This is the same form of reference adopted by the Commission in Decision No. 69994, wherein the canned goods descriptions of Items 320 and 320-1 of Minimum Rate Tariff No. 2 were described in terms of classification item numbers. This method of indexing the existing commodity descriptions of the minimum rate tariff requires only minor adjustments in the current tariff descriptions and facilitates future tariff revisions which become necessary in order to keep each tariff exception item up-to-date with the changes authorized to be made in the governing classification.

The staff, on the other hand, suggests a similar suffix to each tariff description which would describe each commodity "(as classified under Item...)" of the governing classification. Such a provision, among other things, is designed to act as an estoppel to any automatic extension of tariff exception provisions to reflect additional authorized changes in the governing classification until such time as the classification changes are directly published in the minimum rate tariff. Whether the commodity description proposed by the staff would actually accomplish this latter objective is highly questionable and, as to being preferable over what the Commission has previously adopted, involves merely an exercise in semantics. In the absence of persuasive evidence to the contrary, the present method of describing commodities in terms of the governing classification item numbers should be retained. The tariff proposals of petitioner and the staff to be ultimately adopted herein should also reflect certain miscellaneous corrections recommended in the late-filed exhibits.

It is not the Commission's intention in this proceeding to effectuate any substantive revisions in the scope of application of any existing exception provision of Minimum Rate Tariff No. 2. Should a reference to a classification item, in connection with the description of commodities hereinafter adopted, be inadvertently added or omitted so as to result in a significant revision in the current application of the exception provisions of Minimum Rate Tariff No. 2, the matter should be brought to the Commission's attention for remedial action.

The Commission finds that the tariff changes authorized in the following order are justified and will result in just, reasonable and nondiscriminatory minimum rates for the transportation to which they apply.

The Commission concludes that, except to the extent granted herein, Petition No. 406 in Case No. 5432 should be denied; that, except as to the extent authorized herein, the staff proposed revision of Minimum Rate Tariff No. 2 should not be adopted, pending receipt of further evidence at future hearings to be held relative to this and other related matters pursuant to the Commission's Orders Setting Hearings of August 31, 1965 and October 5, 1965, in Cases Nos. 5432 and 7858, respectively.

O R D E R

IT IS ORDERED that:

1. Minimum Rate Tariff No. 2 (Appendix D to Decision No. 31606, as amended) is further amended by incorporating therein, to become effective August 20, 1966, the revised tariff pages attached hereto and listed in Appendix A, also attached hereto, which pages and appendix by this reference are made a part hereof.

2. Tariff publications required to be made by common carriers as a result of the order herein may be made effective not earlier than the tenth day after the effective date of this order on not less than ten days' notice to the Commission and to the public and such tariff publications shall be made effective not later than August 20, 1966; and the tariff publications which are authorized but not required to be made by common carriers as a result of the order herein may be made effective not earlier than the tenth day after the effective date of this order, and may be made effective on not less than ten days' notice to the Commission and to the public if filed not later than sixty days after the effective date of the minimum rate tariff pages incorporated in this order.



3. Common carriers, in establishing and maintaining the rates authorized hereinabove, are hereby authorized to depart from the provisions of Section 460 of the Public Utilities Code to the extent necessary to adjust long- and short-haul departures now maintained under outstanding authorizations; such outstanding authorizations are hereby modified only to the extent necessary to comply with this order; and schedules containing the rates published under this authority shall make reference to the prior orders authorizing long- and short-haul departures and to this order.

4. In all other respects said Decision No. 31606, as amended, shall remain in full force and effect.

5. Except to the extent granted herein, Petition No. 406 in Case No. 5432 is hereby denied.

6. Except to the extent herein authorized, the Commission staff proposed amendment of Minimum Rate Tariff No. 2 is hereby dismissed without prejudice.

7. The Commission's Orders Setting Hearings of August 31, 1965 and October 5, 1965 in Cases Nos. 5432 and 7858, respectively, are hereby continued pending the receipt of further evidence at future hearings to be scheduled in these matters.

The effective date of this order shall be twenty days after the date hereof.
