Application of the County of Los Angeles for the establishment of a grade crossing at the proposed Valencia Boulevard over the Santa Paula Branch Line of the Southern Pacific Company)

O R D E R

The County of Los Angeles is hereby authorized to construct Valencia Boulevard at grade across the Santa Paula Branch track of the Southern Pacific Company, at the location described in the application, to be identified as Crossing No. BE-447.9 in the County of Los Angeles.

Width of the crossing shall not exceed 94 feet and grades of approach shall be not greater than two percent in accordance with plan attached to the application. Construction shall be equal or superior to Standard No. 2 of General Order No. 72. Protection shall be by four Standard No. 8 flashing light signals (General Order No. 75-B) supplemented with automatic crossing gates. Backlights may be omitted from the signals on the medians. Crossing shall not be opened to vehicular traffic until such protection has been placed in service.

Applicant shall bear entire construction expense, also maintenance cost of the crossing outside of lines two feet outside of rails. The Southern Pacific Company shall bear maintenance cost of the crossing between such lines. The maintenance costs of

automatic crossing protection shall be borne by applicant, pursuant to the provisions of Section 1202.2 of the Public Utilities Code.

Within thirty days after completion, pursuant to this order, applicant shall so advise the Commission in writing. This authorization shall expire if not exercised within one year unless time be extended or if above conditions are not complied with. Authorization may be revoked or modified if public convenience, necessity or safety so require.

The effective date of this order shall be twenty days after the date hereof.
