OPINION AND ORDER

By this application, Beckman Express & Warehouse Co. seeks authority to cancel certain hourly rates for the transportation of sand in dump truck equipment.¹

Applicant alleges that there has been no movement of sand under the rates in question and there is no prospect of such a movement in the future. Applicant states that the maintenance of such rates in Tariff No. 8-A serves no useful purpose.

Applicant asserts that the increases resulting from the proposed cancellation of rates would not increase its California intrastate gross revenue by as much as one percent.

The application was listed on the Commission's Daily Calendar of May 16, 1966. No objection to the granting of the application has been received.

In the circumstances, it appears, and the Commission finds, that increases resulting from the proposed cancellation of rates are

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justified. A public hearing is not necessary. The Commission concludes that the application should be granted.

IT IS ORDERED that:

1. Beckman Express & Warehouse Co. is authorized to have the rates on sand canceled from Item No. 1710 of Pacific Motor Tariff Bureau, Inc., Local Freight and Express Tariff No. 8-A, Cal.P.U.C. No. 1 (Series of D. W. Baker, Agent) of Leland C. Smith, Agent, as proposed in the application.

2. Tariff publications authorized to be made as a result of the order herein may be made effective not earlier than thirty days after the effective date of this order on not less than thirty days' notice to the Commission and to the public.

3. The authority herein granted shall expire unless exercised within ninety days after the effective date of this order.

This order shall become effective twenty days after the date hereof.
