ORDER AUTHORIZING TEMPORARY SERVICE

Ordering paragraph (3) of Decision No. 59493, dated January 12, 1960, provides that Yerba Buena Water Company shall not extend its water system or water service outside its certificated area without further order of this Commission.

By letter dated July 16, 1966, the utility has requested authority to render temporary service to the Crippled Children's Society summer camp, which is adjacent to the certificated area, for the summer season of 1966. The utility states that service to the camp would be terminated upon any indication of shortage of water supply.

The Commission finds that such temporary service would not be adverse to the public interest and concludes that the request should be granted. Therefore,

IT IS ORDERED that Yerba Buena Water Company is authorized to render water service to the Crippled Children's

Society summer camp until September 10, 1966, provided, however, that such service shall be subject to immediate termination in the event of a shortage in its water supply.

In all other respects Decision No. 59493, as modified by Decision No. 61403 and Decision No. 61681, shall remain in full force and effect.

The effective date of this order shall be the date hereof.
