OPINION AND ORDER

By this petition, California Trucking Association seeks to have exception ratings on certain commodities canceled from City Carriers' Tariff No. 1-A and the minimum weight provision in said tariff governing the commodity rate on sugar amended.

Petitioner proposes to cancel the exception ratings on "cutlery, other than gold or silver plated," and "sash" and to provide that the minimum weight of 500 tons per calendar month governing the commodity rate on sugar be averaged over 12 calendar months commencing with the month in which the sugar is first transported.¹

Petitioner states that the exception ratings on the cutlery and sash should be deleted from the tariff because they duplicate ratings which are published in the Governing Classification

for the same commodities.² Petitioner avers that sugar is a commodity which is subject to seasonal fluctuation and the minimum weight provision governing the commodity rate on sugar should therefore be amended by allowing the averaging of the tonnages as proposed.

Copies of the petition were mailed to various chambers of commerce, shipper organizations and carrier representatives on or about April 15, 1966. The petition was listed on the Commission's Daily Calendar of April 19, 1966. No objection to the granting of the petition has been received.

In the circumstances, it appears, and the Commission finds that petitioner's proposal is reasonable and that the resulting minimum rates and charges will be just, reasonable and nondiscriminatory minimum rates and charges for the transportation involved. A public hearing is not necessary. The Commission concludes that the petition should be granted.

IT IS ORDERED that:

1. City Carriers' Tariff No. 1-A (Appendix "A" to Decision No. 41363, as amended) is further amended by incorporating therein, to become effective September 17, 1966, Nineteenth Revised Page 3, Nineteenth Revised Page 4, Third Revised Page 28-A and Fourteenth Revised Page 43, attached hereto and by this reference made a part hereof.

City Carriers' Tariff No. 1-A is subject to the provisions of National Motor Freight Classification A-8(CAL) as governed by National Motor Freight Classification A-8, collectively referred to herein as the Governing Classification.

2. In all other respects Decision No. 41363, as amended, shall remain in full force and effect.

The effective date of this order shall be twenty days after the date hereof.
