O P I N I O N

Aero Space Coach Lines, Inc. requests authority to discontinue passenger service for employees of North American Aviation between the plant in Downey, California, on the one hand, and all points and places within a wide service area, on the other hand.

The authority was granted by Decision No. 69551, dated August 17, 1965, in Application No. 47473, and service was commenced on October 4, 1965.

It is alleged that despite extensive publicity and advertising of the service in the company weekly newspaper and on bulletin boards throughout the plant, the employees have failed to use the service.

During the period October 1965 through May 1966, inclusive, applicant transported a total of 680 passengers and experienced a loss of \$6,459.

After consideration the Commission finds that public convenience and necessity no longer require a continuation of applicant's service. A public hearing is not necessary.

O R D E R

IT IS ORDERED that:

1. On September 1, 1966 and on not less than ten days' notice to the Commission and the public, Aero Space Coach Lines, Inc. may discontinue passenger stage service between all points and places as set forth in Decision No. 69551.

2. All tariffs and timetables presently on file with this Commission in applicant's name are canceled.

3. The operative right created by Decision No. 69551, dated August 17, 1965, in Application No. 47473, is revoked.

The effective date of this order shall be August 22, 1966.
