<u>OPINION</u>

Los Angeles Cold Storage Company requests authority to lease a portion of its public utility warehouse space.

Applicant is engaged in the cold storage warehouse business in Los Angeles County serving the Cities of Los Angeles (two warehouses), Pasadena (one warehouse) and Pomona (one warehouse).

Applicant proposes to lease a portion of its cold storage warehouse plant located at 440 South Central Avenue, Los Angeles. The plant has a capacity of 1,902,530 gross cubic feet. The lease covers an area of 240,000 cubic feet for a term of one year at a rental of \$3,600 a month.

It is alleged that 989,315 gross cubic feet of the plant are presently occupied, constituting 52 percent of its storage capacity; since January 1, 1964, the average occupancy has been 1,198,593 gross cubic feet, or 63 percent of the storage capacity; and at no time since January 1, 1964, has more than 82 percent of the storage capacity of the plant been occupied.

After consideration this Commission finds that the proposed lease would not be adverse to the public interest. A public hearing is not necessary.

application.
