ORDER

County of San Joaquin is hereby authorized to reconstruct the crossing of Louise Avenue at grade with a track of Tidewater Southern Railway Company, identified as Crossing No. 75B-3.7, near Manteca, San Joaquin County, as described and substantially as shown in the application. Width of crossing shall be not less than thirty-two feet and grades of approach not greater than one percent. Construction shall be equal or superior to Standard No. 2 of General Order No. 72. Protection shall be by two Standard No. 1 crossing signs (General Order No. 75-B) reflectorized with reflex-reflective sheet material.

Applicant shall bear entire construction expense, also maintenance cost of the crossing outside of lines two feet outside of rails. Tidewater Southern Railway Company shall bear maintenance cost of the crossing between such lines.

Within thirty days after completion pursuant to this order, applicant shall so advise the Commission in writing. This authorization shall expire if not exercised within one year unless

time be extended, or if above conditions are not complied with. Authorization may be revoked or modified if public convenience, necessity, or safety so require. The effective date of this order shall be twenty days after the date hereof.
