O R D E R

The State of California Department of Parks and Recreation is hereby authorized to construct Warner Avenue at grade across the track of the Southern Pacific Company, at the location described in the application, to be identified as Crossing No. 6E-27.20 in the County of Orange.

Width of the crossing and grade of approach shall be in accordance with plans attached to the application. Construction shall be equal or superior to Standard No. 2 of General Order No. 72. Protection shall consist of two Standard No. 1 crossing signs reflectorized with reflex-reflective sheet material. Crossing shall not be opened to vehicular traffic until such protection has been placed in service.

Applicant shall bear entire construction expense, also maintenance cost of the crossing outside of lines two feet outside of rails. The Southern Pacific Company shall bear maintenance cost of the crossing between such lines.

Within thirty days after completion, pursuant to this order, applicant shall so advise the Commission in writing. This authorization shall expire if not exercised within one year unless time be extended or if above conditions are not complied with. Authorization may be revoked or modified if public convenience, necessity or safety so require.

The effective date of this order shall be twenty days after the date hereof.
