ORDER PERMANENTLY SUSPENDING TARIFFS AND DISCONTINUING INVESTIGATION

The order of suspension and investigation herein suspended tariff sheets filed by The Pacific Telephone and Telegraph Company under Advice Letter No. 9169, providing for furnishing of Channels for Television Transmission for Use in Community Antenna Television Systems.

The Pacific Telephone and Telegraph Company on September 21, 1966, filed a supplement to that advice letter, requesting permanent suspension of the tariff sheets because of a change in circumstances and new developments indicating intent to make another filing at a later date including these new developments.

Good cause appearing, IT IS ORDERED that the operation and effectiveness of the rates, classifications, practices or rules in the tariff sheets filed by Advice Letter No. 9169 are hereby permanently suspended; and Case No. 8305 is discontinued without prejudice to further investigatory orders.

The Secretary of the Commission is directed to cause a certified copy of this order to be served forthwith upon The Pacific Telephone and Telegraph Company.

The effective date of this order shall be the date hereof.
