OPINION AND ORDER

Distance Table No. 5 contains the basis for determining constructive mileages, which govern the distance rates in various minimum rate tariffs issued by the Commission. By the above petition California Trucking Association seeks to have the definition of Mileage Basing Point amended by including therein the term, "Unnumbered Junction."

According to the petition, failure to include unnumbered highway functions in the definition of Mileage Basing Point creates an unreasonable and illogical basis for constructive mileage determination. Petitioner alleges that a situation has been inadvertently created, which is not responsive to the intent of the constructive mileage concept nor to the practices of carriers and shippers, and that no useful purpose is served by the mileage designations between such points on the maps contained in the Distance Table unless provisions for such points are made in the definition. Petitioner asserts that the proposed change will create a tariff structure consistent with actual practice and understanding.

Copies of the verified petition were mailed to various chambers of commerce, shipper associations and carrier representatives on or about August 9, 1966. The petition was listed on the Commission's Daily Calendar of August 12, 1966. No objection to the granting of the petition has been received.

- the transportation of:
 - (a) commodities for which minimum rates have not been established, or
 - (b) commodities which are subject to higher rates than, or more restrictive provisions than the minimum rates or provisions otherwise applicable.

Common carriers, in establishing and maintaining the rule authorized hereinabove, are hereby authorized to depart from the provisions of Section 460 of the Public Utilities Code to the extent necessary to adjust long- and short-haul departures now maintained under outstanding authorizations; such outstanding authorizations are hereby modified only to the extent necessary to comply with this order; and schedules containing the rule published under this authority shall make reference to the prior orders authorizing longand short-haul departures and to this order.

5. In all other respects, Decision No. 66578, as amended, shall remain in full force and effect.

This order shall become effective twenty days after the date hereof.
