OPINION AND ORDER

Clarence F. Bertsch (Loleta Water Works) and Jacob and Maxine Czerwieniec by this application seek authority to transfer the Loleta Water Works system from the former to the latter.

By an agreement of sale, entered into on September 13, 1966, buyers would pay the seller a purchase price of \$35,000 with \$1,000 thereof on said date, \$9,000 thereof on the transfer closing date and the balance of \$25,000 payable in monthly installments of \$200 per month and carrying an interest rate of 6 percent per annum. The \$25,000 balance is to be evidenced by a promissory note secured by a Deed of Trust, with the water system as collateral for security of the same.

The water system serves approximately 165 customers. Presently, the source of supply is from springs and an artesian well.

The system also contains a 60,000-gallon concrete reservoir and a 12,000-gallon settling tank. The latest annual report shows a total utility plant cost of \$75,566.31 and a depreciation reserve of \$36,025.29. Buyers will assume any refund obligations for main extensions.

In view of the pleadings and the record before it, the Commission finds (1) that public hearing in the matter is not necessary and (2) that the transfer, as proposed, will not be adverse to the public interest. The money, property or labor to be procured or paid for by the indebtedness herein authorized is reasonably required for the purposes specified herein, and such purposes are not, in whole or in part, reasonably chargeable to operating expenses or to income.

The action taken herein shall not be construed to be a finding of the value of the properties herein authorized to be transferred.

The Commission concludes that the application should be granted.

IT IS ORDERED that:

1. Clarence F. Bertsch is authorized to transfer and sell and Jacob and Maxine Czerwieniec are authorized to purchase and acquire the public utility water system known as the Loleta Water Works, located in the unincorporated community of Loleta, Humboldt County, in accordance with the terms and conditions set forth in Exhibit D and Exhibits Nos. 1, 2, 3, 4 and 5 attached to the application herein.

2. On or before the transfer closing date, Clarence F. Bertsch shall refund all deposits which customers have made for the establishment of credit.

3. The tariffs of Clarence F. Bertsch, now on file with this Commission shall be refiled under the name of the buyers within thirty days of the transfer closing date and in accordance with the provisions of General Order No. 96-A, or in lieu of such refiling

buyers may file a notice of adoption of said presently filed tariffs. No increases in present rates or rules shall be made in said tariffs except upon further order of this Commission.

4. If the authority herein granted is exercised buyers shall, within thirty days after the transfer closing date, notify this Commission in writing of the date on which they assumed operation and control of the water system.

The authority hereinabove granted to issue a note will become effective when applicant has paid the fee prescribed by Section 1904(b) of the Public Utilities Code, which fee is \$25. In all other respects the effective date of this order shall be the date hereof.
