OPINION AND ORDER

Walkup's Merchants Express is a city carrier. By Decision No. 69941 dated November 9, 1965, in Application No. 47953, as amended, applicant was authorized to transport newsprint paper, in rolls, within San Francisco at rates lower than the established minimum rates for Crown Zellerbach Corporation, Powell River-Alberni Sales Corporation, British Columbia Forest Products, Ltd., West Tacoma Newsprint Company, Publishers Paper Company and Madden Corporation and twelve newspaper publishers.<sup>1</sup> The currently authorized rates are 10½ and 13 cents per 100 pounds, subject to minima of 25,000 and 6,000 tons per calendar year, respectively. The authority also permits departure from the minimum rate provisions governing tailgate loading and tailgate unloading. The current authority is scheduled to expire with November 27, 1966.

The newspaper publishers are: San Francisco Newspaper Publishing Co., The Wall Street Journal, The San Francisco Shopping News Co., Henry F. Budde Publications, Inc., The Garrett Press, Pacific School and Office Supply, Inc., Color Offset Press, L'Italia, Nichi Bei Times, Recorder Printing & Publishing Co., Waller Press and Stark-Rath Printing Co.

By this application applicant seeks to assess the same less-than-minimum rates as have been heretofore authorized, with certain modifications, for a one-year period.

Applicant alleges that the facts and circumstances which justified the departure from the minimum rates as now authorized remain unchanged except that since the time the previous decision was issued, the Hearst Publications, Inc., and the San Francisco Chronicle have merged their printing operations which are now being accomplished by the San Francisco Newspaper Publishing Co., and deliveries of newsprint paper for their accounts are now being made to the last named corporation.

Applicant states that except for the change of name, the transportation characteristics of the service are identical with those which were performed separately for the Hearst Publications, Inc., and the San Francisco Chronicle.

Revenue and expense data submitted by applicant indicate that the transportation involved has been profitable and reasonably may be expected to be profitable for the ensuing year.

The certificate of service shows that copies of the verified application were mailed to California Trucking Association and Draymen's Association of San Francisco, Inc., on September 29, 1966. The application was listed on the Commission's Daily Calendar of October 3, 1966. No objection to the granting of the application has been received.

In the circumstances, it appears, and the Commission finds, that applicant's proposal is reasonable and consistent with the public interest. A public hearing is not necessary. The Commission concludes that the application should be granted. In view of the impending expiration date of the current authority, the order which follows will be made effective on November 27, 1966.

IT IS ORDERED that:

1. Walkup's Merchants Express is hereby authorized to depart from the provisions of City Carriers' Tariff No. 1-A applicable to the transportation of newsprint paper, in rolls, to the extent specifically provided in Appendix A attached hereto and by this reference made a part hereof.

2. The authority granted herein shall, on and after November 27, 1966, supersede the authority granted by Decision No. 69941 and shall expire with November 27, 1967.

This order shall become effective November 27, 1966.

Item 1

Newsprint Paper, in rolls, transported for Crown Zellerbach Corporation, Powell River-Alberni Sales Corporation, British Columbia Forest Products, Ltd., West Tacoma Newsprint Company and Publishers Paper Company to the San Francisco Newspaper Publishing Co., in aggregate quantities of not less than 25,000 tons per calendar year; and any such newsprint paper, in rolls, transported from storage for the San Francisco Newspaper Publishing Co. after having had a prior haul for any of said shippers.

(1) \$.10-1/2 per 100 pounds.

Item 2

Newsprint Paper, in rolls, transported for Crown Zellerbach Corporation, Powell River-Alberni Sales Corporation and Madden Corporation, in aggregate quantities of not less than 9,000 tons per calendar year to any of the following: The Wall Street Journal, The San Francisco Shopping News Co., Henry F. Budde Publications, Inc., The Garrett Press, Pacific School and Office Supply, Inc., Color Offset Press, L'Italia, Nichi Bei Times, Recorder Printing & Publishing Co., Waller Press and Stark-Rath Printing Co.; and any of such newsprint paper, in rolls, transported from storage for any of the aforementioned publishers after having had a prior haul for Crown Zellerbach Corporation, Powell River-Alberni Sales Corporation or Madden Corporation.

(1) \$.13 per 100 pounds.

Except as otherwise provided herein, rates and charges named in this exhibit are subject to the rules and regulations provided in City Carriers' Tariff No. 1-A (Appendix A of Decision No. 41363, as amended, in Case No. 4084).
