to (1) construct one temporary
crossing of a railroad track by a
public street, and (2) modify one
existing crossing of a railroad track
by a public street, in the City of
Long Beach, County of Los Angeles,
State of California.

O R D E R

The City of Long Beach is hereby authorized to reconstruct the crossing of Seaside Boulevard (Crossing No. 3A-23.88-C) and to construct a temporary crossing of Seaside Boulevard at grade, with track of the Union Pacific Railroad Company, to be identified as Crossing No. 3A-23.89-C, in the City of Long Beach, County of Los Angeles as described and substantially as shown in the application.

Width of the reconstructed crossing shall be not less than 84 feet and grades of approach not greater than two percent. Protection for the reconstructed crossing shall be by four Standard No. 8 flashing light signals (General Order No. 75-B). Backlights may be omitted from signals mounted on center of roadway medians.

Width of the temporary crossing shall be not less than 44 feet and grades of approach not greater than six percent. Protection for the temporary crossing shall be by two Standard No. 8 flashing light signals (General Order No. 75-B). Construction of each crossing shall be equal or superior to Standard No. 2 of General Order No. 72.

Upon completion of the reconstructed Crossing No. 3A-23.88-C, the temporary Crossing No. 3A-23.89-C shall be abandoned and physically removed.

Construction and maintenance costs of the crossings shall be borne in accordance with an agreement to be entered into between the parties. Should the parties fail to agree, the Commission will apportion the costs by further order.

Within thirty days after completion, pursuant to this order, applicant shall so advise the Commission in writing. This authorization shall expire if not exercised within one year, unless time be extended, or if above conditions are not complied with. Authorization may be revoked or modified if public convenience, necessity or safety so require.

The effective date of this order shall be the date hereof.
