Application of the Town of Emeryville, a  
 municipal corporation of the State of  
 California for an existing grade crossing  
 at the Southern Pacific Company railroad  
 spur track at Shellmound Street in the Town  
 of Emeryville, State of California. (Mile  
 Post No. 7.38) ) Application No. 48687  
 (Filed August 4, 1966)

ORDER

The Town of Emeryville is hereby authorized to construct Shellmound Street at grade across a spur track of Southern Pacific Company in the Town of Emeryville, Alameda County, at the location described in the application to be identified as Crossing No. A-7.38-C.

Width of crossing shall be not less than forty feet and grades of approach not greater than three percent. Construction shall be equal or superior to Standard No. 2 of General Order No. 72. Protection shall be by two Standard No. 8 flashing light signals (General Order No. 75-B).

Applicant shall bear entire expense of construction and installation of automatic protection, also maintenance cost of the crossing outside of lines two feet outside of rails. Southern Pacific Company shall bear maintenance cost of the crossing between such lines. Maintenance costs of the automatic protection shall be borne by the applicant, pursuant to the provisions of Section 1202.2 of the Public Utilities Code.

This authorization shall expire if not exercised within one year unless time be extended or if above conditions are not complied with. Authorization may be revoked or modified if public convenience, necessity, or safety so require. The effective date of this order shall be twenty days after the date hereof.
