ORDER EXTENDING TIME
FOR
PAYMENT OF FINES

Decision 71388 found Walnut Trucking Co., Inc., David R. Rydbom, and William L. Thomas to be guilty of contempt and imposed fines of \$100 on each respondent, to be paid within ten days after the effective date of the order. Personal service of the decision was made on the first two respondents on October 14, 1966, and on the third respondent on October 17, 1966. Thus, the effective date of the order was November 3, 1966 as to the first two respondents, and November 6, 1966 as to the third respondent, making the fines payable not later than November 13, 1966 and November 16, 1966, respectively.

Petition for rehearing was filed on November 4, 1966, one day after the effective date as to the first two respondents, and two days before the effective date as to the third respondent. Petitioners request a stay of the order. Solely for the purpose of consideration of the petition for rehearing, IT IS ORDERED that time for payment of the fines imposed by Decision 71388 is extended to a time to be fixed by further Commission order herein.
