<u>OPINION</u>

Western California Telephone Company requests
authority from the Commission to issue new notes in renewal or
successive renewals of short-term notes in the aggregate
principal amount of \$4,650,000.

Applicant advises that it has issued a \$4,000,000 note in favor of California Water & Telephone Company and three short-term notes totaling \$650,000 in favor of General Telephone & Electronics Corporation, all bearing interest at the prime commercial rate. It appears that said \$4,000,000 note was issued pursuant to authority previously granted by this Commission. According to the application, the indebtedness represented by said notes was incurred originally for construction, completion and improvement of applicant's facilities or for reimbursement of applicant's treasury.

renewals thereof. The notes shall bear interest at the prevailing prime commercial rate, shall mature not later than December 31, 1967, and shall be in the same form, or in substantially the same form, as that attached to the application as Exhibit B.

- 2. Western California Telephone Company shall file with the Commission a report, or reports, as required by General Order No. 24-B, which order, insofar as applicable, is hereby made a part of this order.
- 3. This order shall become effective when Western California Telephone Company has paid the fee prescribed by Section 1904(b) of the Public Utilities Code, which fee is \$650.
