OPINION AND ORDER

Minimum Rate Tariff No. 8 names minimum rates, rules and regulations for the transportation of fresh or green fruits and vegetables and related articles by city and highway permit carriers. By this petition, California Trucking Association seeks general increases, with certain exceptions, in the minimum rates named in the above tariff as outlined in its Amended Exhibit A attached to the amended petition. Petitioner asks that the tariff revisions be made effective before January 15, 1967, and that common carriers be directed to establish in their respective tariffs such modifications as may be prescribed by the Commission's order in this proceeding, including relief from the long- and short-haul provisions of Section 460 of the Public Utilities Code.

Petitioner proposes to increase (1) certain hundredweight rates from 1 to 6 cents per 100 pounds depending upon the weight of the shipment and the distance involved; and (2) other rates by 5 percent, subject to a minimum increase of 1 cent per 100 pounds in the other hundredweight rates, 50 cents per hour in the hourly rates, 25 cents in the minimum charges and 1 cent per package in the package rates.

Petitioner alleges that various interested parties, basically those previously described as the "Carrier-Shipper"group by the Commission,¹ have discussed the proposed tariff changes and determined that they are reasonable and proper in the circumstances. Petitioner avers that such tariff changes would provide increases in almost all tariff items so that all involved would share proportionately in the rate increases. According to petitioner, the proposed tariff changes would provide increased revenues, which would offset increased carrier costs with a minimum disruption of agricultural marketing patterns.

Petitioner's verified statement, identified as Exhibit B and attached to the amended petition, sets forth the factual background of the need for the proposed tariff adjustments.

Petitioner states that the proposed tariff revisions will be in the best interests of both shippers and carriers of produce and their representatives and asserts that the seasonal characteristics of the transportation involved and the desires of both shippers and carriers for a mutually acceptable effective date for such tariff changes necessitate expedited action in this matter.

Copies of the petition and amendment were mailed to various shippers and shipper associations on or about July 19 and November 29, 1966, respectively. The petition and amendment were listed on the Commission's Daily Calendar of July 21 and December 1, 1966, respectively. California Farm Bureau Federation has informed the Commission by letter that it supports petitioner's proposal. No objection to the granting of the petition, as amended, has been received.

See Decision No. 68921 dated April 20, 1965, in Case No. 5438 (Petition for Modification No. 30).

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C. 5438 (Pet. 57) - ag

In the circumstances, it appears, and the Commission finds, that petitioner's proposal is reasonable and that the resulting minimum rates and charges will be just, reasonable and nondiscriminatory minimum rates and charges for the transportation of fresh fruits and vegetables and related articles and that the increases involved are justified. A public hearing is not necessary. The petition, as amended, should be granted.

IT IS ORDERED that:

1. Minimum Rate Tariff No. 8 (Appendix "C" to Decision No. 33977, as amended) is further amended by incorporating therein, to become effective January 14, 1967, the revised tariff pages attached hereto and listed in Appendix A, also attached hereto, which pages and appendix are by this reference made a part hereof.

2. The tariff amendment established in Ordering Paragraph l hereof may also be established by common carriers in connection with the transportation of:

- (a) commodities for which minimum rates have not been established, or
- (b) commodities which are subject to higher rates than, or more restrictive provisions than, the minimum rates or provisions otherwise applicable.

3. Tariff publications required to be made by common carriers as a result of the order herein may be made effective not earlier than the fifth day after the effective date of this order on not less than five days' notice to the Commission and to the public and such tariff publications shall be made effective not later than January 14, 1967; and tariff publications which are authorized but not required to be made by common carriers as a result of the order herein may be made effective not earlier than the fifth day

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after the effective date of this order, and may be made effective on not less than five days' notice to the Commission and to the public if filed not later than sixty days after the effective date of the minimum rate tariff pages incorporated in this order.

4. Common carriers, in establishing and maintaining the rates and charges authorized hereinabove, are authorized to depart from the provisions of Section 460 of the Public Utilities Code to the extent necessary to adjust long- and short-haul departures now maintained under outstanding authorizations; such outstanding authorizations are hereby modified only to the extent necessary to comply with this order; and schedules containing the rates and charges published under this authority shall make reference to the prior orders authorizing long- and short-haul departures and to this order.

5. In all other respects Decision No. 33977, as amended, shall remain in full force and effect.

The effective date of this order shall be twenty days after the date hereof.
