In the matter of the application of the CITY OF MERCED, a charter city, for an order permitting the widening and improving of Crossing No. B-151.1 at "G" Street and the Southern Pacific Railroad, City of Merced.

<u>order</u>

City of Merced is hereby authorized to widen and improve the crossing of "G" Street at grade with tracks of Southern Pacific Company, Crossing No. B-151.1 in the City of Merced, Merced County, as described and substantially as shown in the application. Width of crossing shall be not less than 64 feet and grades of approach not greater than 5 percent. Construction shall be equal or superior to Standard No. 2 of General Order No. 72. Protection shall be by two Standard No. 3 crossing signals (General Order No. 75-B) augmented with automatic gate arms.

Construction expense shall be borne in accordance with an agreement entered into between the parties or, if they fail to agree, by further order of the Commission. Maintenance cost of the crossing outside of lines two feet outside of rails shall be borne by applicant. Southern Facific Company shall bear maintenance cost of the crossing between such lines. Maintenance cost of the automatic crossing protection shall be divided pursuant to the provisions of Section 1202.2 of the Public Utilities Code.

The additional lanes shall not be opened to public use until the protection ordered herein is installed and operative.

Within thirty days after completion pursuant to this order, applicant shall so advise the Commission in writing. This authorization shall expire if not exercised within one year unless

time be extended, or if above conditions are not complied with. Authorization may be revoked or modified if public convenience, necessity, or safety so require. The effective date of this order shall be twenty days after the date hereof.
