OPINION

On June 8, 1966, Minnie Mae Collier, residing at 242
Shields Street, San Francisco, California, filed a complaint against the defendant, alleging her telephone service under number 586-9126 had been discontinued without cause; that the defendant refused service; and that complainant has never used and does not intend to use the telephone facilities as an instrumentality to violate the law or aid or abet violation of law. On June 14, 1966, the Commission ordered interim restoration of service (Decision No. 70857).

A public hearing was held before Examiner Porter on August 12, 1966, at San Francisco. There was no appearance by or on behalf of the complainant nor by anylaw enforcement agency. By letter dated November 29, 1966, complainant requests dismissal of the complaint.
