FIRST SUPPLEMENTAL ORDER

By Decision No. 70543, dated April 5, 1966, the Commission authorized the City of Sunnyvale to construct Fair Oaks Avenue at separated grades over the tracks of Southern Pacific Company in Sunnyvale, Santa Clara County, providing among other conditions that during construction of this grade separation the Fair Oaks Avenue Crossing No. E-39.3 was to be physically closed and abandoned.

The City of Sunnyvale has requested that the Commission modify Decision No. 70543 to authorize the use of the existing crossing at grade at Fair Oaks Avenue for pedestrians only, until such time as the pedestrian overhead grade separation is completed and opened to pedestrian traffic.

The first sentence of the third paragraph on page one of Decision No. 70543 reading, "During the construction of this grade separation the Fair Oaks Avenue Crossing No. E-39.3 is to be physically closed and abandoned and the traffic is to be detoured over the existing Wolfe Road Crossing No. E-39.7.", is hereby amended to read as follows: "During the construction of this grade separation, the Fair Oaks Avenue Crossing No. E-39.3 may remain open as a pedestrian crossing at grade, but it shall be physically closed to

vehicular traffic and the vehicular traffic is to be detoured over the existing Wolfe Road Crossing No. E-39.7. Protection of the pedestrian crossing at grade shall be by two Standard No. 3 crossing signals (General Order No. 75-B). When the pedestrian overhead grade separation is opened to pedestrian traffic, Fair Oaks Avenue Crossing No. E-39.3 shall be physically closed and abandoned to all traffic."
