OPINION AND ORDER

Minimum Rate Tariff No. 2, City Carriers' Tariff No. 1-A and Minimum Rate Tariffs Nos. 1-B, 5 and 9-B name minimum rates and rules for the transportation of general commodities by highway carriers statewide, city carriers within San Francisco and city carriers and highway carriers between points in the East Bay, Los Angeles and San Diego drayage areas, respectively. By these petitions, Pacific Dairy & Poultry Association seeks (1) to have established in the above tariffs various exception ratings for the transportation of dressed or eviscerated poultry and poultry parts

The following ratings are sought: first class, any quantity and fourth class, minimum weight 10,000 pounds in all of the above tariffs; fifth class, minimum weight 30,000 pounds, and Class B, minimum weight 36,000 pounds, in City Carriers' Tariff No. 1-A and Minimum Rate Tariffs Nos. 1-B and 2; 65 percent of first class, minimum weight 36,000 pounds, in Minimum Rate Tariff No. 9-B; and Class C, minimum weight 42,000 pounds, in Minimum Rate Tariff No.2.

and (2) to have exempted from the application of the rates named in the aforementioned drayage tariffs the transportation of live poultry. Petitioner asks that all common carriers be authorized to establish in their respective tariffs all such modifications as may be prescribed by the Commission's orders in these proceedings, including relief from the long- and short-haul provisions of Section 460 of the Public Utilities Code. Petitioner requests that action in this matter be expedited so that orderly revisions in distribution programs may be made prior to March 26, 1967.

Petitioner states that the provisions of the above tariffs governing the transportation of poultry produced and shipped within the State of California have not been updated in a comprehensive manner for many years. Dependent upon the particular product and the particular points of origin and destination, petitioner alleges that the presently applicable tariffs provide for complete exemption of the MOVement, the application of special rates or the use of class rates, and that the criteria utilized for differentiation and the resultant charges for transportation are not definite and clear.

Petitioner declares that the proposed tariff revisions are consistent with current Commission policies involving agricultural movements and recognize technological changes in carrier equipment and operating practices of shippers and carriers of poultry. Petitioner avers that the proposed tariff changes have been reviewed by the various shippers and carriers of poultry and their representatives and that the tariff revisions are generally desired by such parties and will be in their best interests.

Copies of the verified petitions were mailed to interested parties, including California Farm Bureau Federation and California Trucking Association, on or about January 12, 1967. The petitions were listed on the Commission's Daily Calendar of January 17, 1967. No objection to the granting of the petitions has been received.

In the circumstances, it appears, and the Commission finds, that petitioner's proposal, as hereinafter modified, is reasonable, that the resulting minimum rates will be just, reasonable and nondiscriminatory minimum rates for the transportation of dressed or eviscerated poultry and poultry parts and that the increases involved are justified. Items Nos. 360 and 730 of City Carriers' Tariff No. 1-A and Minimum Rate Tariff No. 1-B, respectively, provide that the fifth class rates named therein apply in connection with Class B, C, D and E truckload ratings set forth in the Governing Classification and the sought Class B ratings will not therefore be established in such tariffs. A public hearing is not necessary. The Commission concludes that the petitions, as modified, should be granted. Minimum Rate Tariff No. 2 will be amended accordingly by the order herein. In order to avoid duplication of tariff distribution, City Carriers' Tariff No. 1-A and Minimum Rate Tariffs Nos. 1-B, 5 and 9-B will be amended by separate orders.

IT IS ORDERED that:

- 1. Minimum Rate Tariff No. 2 (Appendix "D" to Decision No. 31606, as amended) is hereby further amended by incorporating therein, to become effective March 26, 1967, Thirty-ninth Revised Page 8, Forty-fifth Revised Page 15, Fourth Revised Page 15-A and Sixth Revised Page 38-C, attached hereto and by this reference made a part hereof.
- 2. Tariff publications required to be made by common carriers as a result of the order herein may be made effective not earlier than the tenth day after the effective date of this order on not less than ten days' notice to the Commission and to the public and such tariff publications shall be made effective not later than March 26, 1967; and tariff publications which are authorized but not required to be made by common carriers as a result of the order herein may be made effective not earlier than the tenth day after the effective date of this order, and may be made effective on not less

than ten days' notice to the Commission and to the public if filed not later than sixty days after the effective date of the minimum rate tariff pages incorporated in this order.

3. Common carriers, in establishing and maintaining the

3. Common carriers, in establishing and maintaining the ratings and rules authorized hereinabove, are hereby authorized to depart from the provisions of Section 460 of the Public Utilities Code to the extent necessary to adjust long- and short-haul departures now maintained under outstanding authorizations; such outstanding authorizations are hereby modified only to the extent necessary to comply with this order; and schedules containing the ratings and rules published under this authority shall make reference to the prior orders authorizing long- and short-haul departures and to this order.

4. In all other respects, Decision No. 31606, as amended, shall remain in full force and effect.

The effective date of this order shall be twenty days after the date hereof.
