ORDER REVOKING WAREHOUSE OPERATIVE RIGHT

Lee F. Taylor Company, Inc., possesses a prescriptive operative right as a public utility warehouseman at Stockton.

In investigating the public utility status of this warehouseman, the Commission staff was informed by Lee F. Taylor that the public utility warehouse operations in question were discontinued about December of 1961.

Lee F. Taylor Company, Inc., having discontinued service as a public utility warehouseman without proper authority, the Commission finds that such discontinuance of service constitutes good cause for revocation of the prescriptive warehouse operative right involved and cancellation of the tariff applicable to the service thereunder.

IT IS ORDERED that:

- 1. The prescriptive operative right as a public utility warehouseman possessed by Lee F. Taylor Company, Inc., as determined by order dated August 9, 1960, in Case No. 6752 is hereby revoked.
- 2. Warehouse Tariff No. 1, Cal.P.U.C. No. 1 (Series of Lee F. Taylor), is hereby canceled.

The Secretary is directed to cause service of a certified copy of this order to be made upon Lee F. Taylor Company, Inc., or to mail a certified copy thereof to it at its last known address as shown in the Commission's records and to mail a copy of this order to Lee F. Taylor, 131 East Adams Street, Stockton, California.

The effective date of this order shall be the thirtieth day after such service upon Lee F. Taylor Company, Inc., or after the above mailing to it unless before such effective date there shall have been filed with this Commission a written request for public hearing, in which event the effective date of this order shall be stayed until further order of the Commission.
