ORDER REVOKING OPERATIVE RIGHT

The certificate of public convenience and necessity granted to Mack Nishimoto, doing business as Nishimoto Bros., was suspended on December 18, 1965, for failure to have on file requisite evidence of liability insurance and was continued in suspension on August 4, 1966, for failure to have on file the required tariffs. The carrier has not filed the required evidence of liability insurance or tariffs since that date.

Mack Nishimoto having failed to have on file evidence of liability insurance and tariffs, the Commission finds that such failures constitute good cause for revocation of the certificate.

IT IS ORDERED that the certificate of public convenience and necessity to operate as a highway common carrier granted to Mack Nishimoto by Decision No. 53939 dated October 16, 1956, in Application No. 36196 is hereby revoked.

The Secretary is directed to cause service of a certified copy of this order to be made upon Mack Nishimoto or to mail a certified copy thereof to him at his last known address as shown in the Commission's records.

The effective date of this order shall be the thirtieth day after such service upon Mack Nishimoto or after the above mailing to him unless before such effective date there shall have been filed with this Commission a written request for public hearing, in which event the effective date of this order shall be stayed until further order of the Commission.
