ORDER OF DISMISSAL

On November 17, 1966, San Miguel Telephone Company of California (San Miguel) filed its Advice Letter No. 38 and Cal. P.U.C. Sheets Nos. 336-T and 337-T, requesting expansion of its Timber Cove exchange.

The Pacific Telephone and Telegraph Company, on October 24, 1966, filed under Advice Letter No. 9403 an expansion of its Annapolis exchange by approximately 13.9 square miles. This filing became effective on November 24, 1966. 7.2 square miles of such filing are in conflict with the filing of San Miguel.

On November 22, 1966, the Commission opened the case herein.

By letter dated January 20, 1967, the president of San Miguel requested that the suspension of Advice Letter No. 38 and accompanying tariff sheets be made permanent and that Case No. 8565 be dismissed. Good cause appearing,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that:

1. The suspension of Advice Letter No. 38 and Cal. P.U.C. Sheets Nos. 336-T and 337-T is made permanent.
2. Case No. 8565 is discontinued.
