ORDER DISMISSING APPLICATION
AND DISCONTINUING INVESTIGATION

This application and the investigation concern the status of the protection of a grade crossing of the tracks of the Southern Pacific Company and Wild Duck Road.

By letter dated December 16, 1966, applicant has requested dismissal of its application and has informed the Commission that it will install two Standard No. 1 crossing signs reflectorized with reflex-reflective material. The Commission's Transportation Division

has informed us that in its opinion the proposed signs will provide adequate protection at the crossing. It recommends discontinuance of the investigation; therefore, good cause appearing,

IT IS ORDERED that Application No. 48775 is dismissed and the investigation in Case No. 8558 is discontinued.
