In the Matter of the Application of MALCO TRANSPORTATION COMPANY, a corporation, for the abandonment of presently held certificates of convenience and necessity to operate as a highway common carrier and as a petroleum irregular route carrier.

OPINION

By authority of Decision No. 51100, dated February 15, 1955, in Application No. 36627, Malco acquired certificates as a highway common carrier and petroleum irregular route carrier. They were originally granted to L. P. Eeles by Decision No. 44557, in Application No. 29506, and Decision No. 44597, in Application No. 31255. It also possessed a city carrier permit. All of its authority was suspended in 1965. The permit has been revoked. The certificates are technically revived by termination of the suspensions.

By the instant application Malco seeks permission to abandon its certificated services. It alleges that it has rendered no service since prior to July 13, 1965 and it presently has neither the organization nor the equipment to render the authorized service. It has no evidence of insurance on file. Western Motor Tariff Bureau canceled Malco's participation in its tariffs on December 20, 1965.

The application has been on file since September 6, 1966 and no protests have been received.

The Commission finds and concludes that the application should be granted.

There are no evidences of insurance or tariff filings to be canceled.

A public hearing is not necessary.

ORDER

IT IS ORDERED that the certificates of public convenience and necessity to operate as a highway common carrier and petroleum irregular route carrier acquired by Malco Transportation Company, a corporation, by Decision No. 51100, dated February 15, 1955, in Application No. 36627, are hereby revoked.

The effective date of this order shall be twenty days after the date hereof.
