Application No. 49065 Filed January 3, 1967 OPINION Applicant Stanislaus Farm Supply Company filed its application herein requesting that the Commission find that the applicant, during the entire time of its operations, was a nonprofit agricultural cooperative doing business only with its members and as such was not entitled to any of the benefits and privileges as a warehouseman as defined in the Public Utilities Code, and that the Commission issue an order revoking applicant's operative right as a public utility warehouseman as of the date it acquired its said warehouse pursuant to Decision No. 56934 issued July 8, 1958, in Application No. 40169, and revoking the prescriptive operative right as a public utility warehouseman of which applicant was declared the possessor in Case No. 6872, dated August 23, 1960. No protest to the granting of the application has been filed with this Commission. Based upon a consideration of the allegations set forth in the application herein, the Commission finds as follows: The Stanislaus Farm Supply Company, the applicant herein, was incorporated as a nonprofit agricultural cooperative association under articles of incorporation executed on June 13, 1949, and filed with the Secretary of State on August 14, 1949, pursuant to the provisions of Chapter 4, Division 6 of the Agricultural Code. -1A.49065 NB 2. By Decision No. 56934, issued July 8, 1958, in Application No. 40169, Adelbert Pflaging, doing business as W. H. Sisk Warehouse, was authorized to transfer his public utility warehouse business and property to applicant, and applicant was authorized to acquire said public utility warehouse business and property. 3. From the date of the purchase of said warehouse business and property the Stanislaus Farm Supply Company has operated said warehouse as a nonprofit agricultural cooperative association solely for the benefit of its members and not for the general public. 4. Applicant's income from its bean cleaning and warehouse operations at said warehouse for the period 1957 through the fiscal year 1965-1966 amounted to \$29,916.75, and all of said income was received from members of the applicant. 5. Following the 1959 amendments to Sections 1051 and 1052 of the Public Utilities Code, this Commission, in Case No. 6872, issued its order, dated August 23, 1960, determining that applicant possessed a prescriptive right as a public utility warehouseman. 6. Said order in Case No. 6872 was issued on the basis of an affidavit referred to therein as Exhibit No. 1 and executed by Mr. Joseph Sousa, manager of applicant. 7. At the time of the execution and filing of the affidavit Mr. Sousa was unaware of the provisions of Section 239(b) of the Public Utilities Code which exempted applicant from the definition of a "warehouseman" when dealing only with storage for members of an agricultural nonprofit cooperative association or corporation. 8. Said affidavit states that the commodities, i. e., beans and grain, stored in the warehouse on September 1, 1959 belonged to -2-

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3. Jack L.
