ORDER SETTING ASIDE SUBMISSION
AND REOPENING FOR FURTHER HEARING

A public hearing on the above-entitled matter was held in the city of San Buenaventura, California, on February 8, 1967, and the matter was submitted. The County of Ventura, among other entities, appeared at the hearing and presented evidence.

On March 16, 1967, the County of Ventura filed a petition to reopen the proceeding. In said petition it alleges that it desires to introduce additional testimony not available during the hearing; that preliminary studies indicate a routing of a primary roadway in such a manner as to possibly change the County's official position as indicated in the official transcript; and that documents which have come to light since the hearing indicate possible prior roadway rights in the vicinity of one of the crossings involved.

The County of Ventura's petition states it will require approximately ten weeks to prepare for hearing and requests a hearing after May 20, 1967.

Therefore, IT IS ORDERED that the submission of Case No. 8502 is set aside and the matter is reopened for further hearing to be held before Examiner Rogers at a time and a place to be determined.
