ORDER EXTENDING TIME





By Decision No. 71908, dated January 24, 1967, Southern Pacific Company, a corporation, was ordered to install signalling on the Yorba Linda and Wilmington Branches of its Los Angeles Division - Terminal Subdivision by not later than 90 days after the effective date of the order.

On April 13, 1967, Southern Pacific Company advised that it does not appear possible to complete the signalling work by the time authorized (May 14, 1967) due to government priorities causing delays in obtaining the necessary wiring. It is requested that a 60-day extension of time be granted.

Therefore, good cause appearing, IT IS ORDERED that the time within which to install signalling equipment pursuant to Decision No. 71908 is hereby extended to and including July 14, 1967.

The effective date of this order shall be the date hereof.
