OPINION AND ORDER

Each of the ten applicants holds either a radial highway com-  
mon carrier or a highway contract carrier permit. <sup>1</sup> By Decision No.  
71006 dated July 19, 1966, in Application No. 48533, as amended by  
Decision No. 71794 dated December 29, 1966, they were authorized to  
transport truckload shipments of building blocks from the plant of  
Basalt Rock Company, Inc. at Napa at rates less than the established  
minimum rates. <sup>2</sup> The current authority is scheduled to expire with  
July 31, 1967. By this application, applicants seek an extension of  
their current authorities for a further one-year period.

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<sup>1</sup> Minor discrepancies exist between certain applicants' names as they appear in the application and as they appear in the Commission's official records. Each applicant will be referred to by the name shown in the Commission's official records.

<sup>2</sup> The decision also authorized the transportation of building blocks from Napa by Marie E. Kenyon and Frank A. Noceti, and from French Camp by Gilbert J. Behlen, Gertrude M. Ferrera, Andrew J. Kooker, James O. McCafferty, Edgar Stanful and Ynes C. Zavala at less-than-minimum rates. These parties and the origin point of French Camp are not involved in the instant proceeding.

Applicants aver that they are engaged solely in serving Basalt and that the transportation circumstances in the decision, which justified the granting of the original rate authorities, continue to exist and require that the sought authorities be granted. As indicated in that decision, favorable transportation conditions include the loading of palletized building blocks by the shipper and the waiving of any claim by the shipper for loss or damage as the result of normal handling by the carriers involved.

Revenue and expense data submitted by each applicant indicate that the transportation involved has been profitable and reasonably may be expected to be profitable in the future.

The certificate of service shows that a copy of the application was mailed to California Trucking Association on May 29, 1967. The application was listed on the Commission's Daily Calendar of June 2, 1967. No objection to the granting of the application has been received.

In the circumstances, it appears, and the Commission finds, that the proposed rates are reasonable for transportation to be performed by each of the applicants named herein. A public hearing is not necessary. The Commission concludes that the application should be granted.

IT IS ORDERED that:

1. Sam Clerici, Tom E. Cramer, Frolly F. Crumpton, Helen B. Ellington, Joe I. Flax, Robert H. Guck, Rudolph Maynard, Arthur H. Savano, Ferd E. Silva and Lloyd M. Tyler are hereby authorized to transport building blocks in truckload shipments for Basalt Rock Company, Inc., from the latter's plant at Napa to points and places in California at rates less than the established minimum

rates but not less than those set forth, and subject to the conditions specified, in Appendix A attached hereto and by this reference made a part hereof.

2. The authorities granted herein shall, on and after July 31, 1967, supersede the authorities granted by Decision No. 71006, as amended by Decision No. 71794, and shall expire with July 31, 1968.


This order shall become effective twenty days after the date hereof.

Schedule of Minimum Rates for  
the Transportation of Building Blocks  
for Basalt Rock Company, Inc.

Section 1

Item 10 Application of Rates - General

To the extent that Minimum Rate Tariff No. 2 prescribes minimum rates for the transportation of building blocks, said minimum rates, rules and regulations are applicable to all shipments except as specifically provided in Section 2.

Section 2

Item 20 Application of Rates - Commodity

Rates in this section apply to the transportation of building blocks as described in Item 32040 of National Motor Freight Classification A-9 when power loaded by shipper at origin with the shipper's equipment and power unloaded by carrier at destination with a forklift which carrier may furnish.

Item 30 Application of Rates - Territory

Rates in this section apply only between the plant of Basalt Rock Company at Napa, on the one hand, and points and places in California, on the other hand.

Item 40 Surcharges

Rates in this section are subject to the provisions set forth in Supplement No. 66, or any reissue thereof, to Minimum Rate Tariff No. 2.
