ORDER EXTENDING PERIOD OF SUSPENSION

By an order of suspension and investigation, issued April 4, 1967, certain tariff sheets of The Pacific Telephone and Telegraph Company filed under Advice Letter No. 9491 were suspended until August 6, 1967, pending public hearing and further order of the Commission. It appears that conclusion of the matter may not be accomplished by August 6, 1967.

IT IS ORDERED that the operation and effectiveness of the tariff sheets filed under respondent's Advice Letter No. 9491 are hereby suspended, as provided by statute, for an additional period of six months to and including February 6, 1968, unless otherwise hereafter ordered.
