ORDER EXTENDING PERIOD OF SUSPENSION

By an order of suspension and investigation, issued April 4, 1967, certain tariff sheets filed under Advice Letter No. 9496 by The Pacific Telephone and Telegraph Company were suspended until August 13, 1967, pending public hearing and further order of the Commission. It appears that conclusion of the matter may not be accomplished by August 13, 1967.

Good cause appearing therefor,

IT IS ORDERED that the operation and effectiveness of the tariff sheets filed by respondent's Advice Letter No. 9496 are hereby suspended, as provided by statute, for an additional period of six months to and including February 13, 1968, unless otherwise hereafter ordered.
