O P I N I O N

County Transit Lines, Inc., requests authority to reroute its bus Routes Nos. 1, 2, 3 and 4 in Contra Costa County in order to afford better service to the public and because some of the streets referred to in the present route are one-way streets leading in the opposite direction and some of them are unusable because of deadends or construction problems.

No protests have been received.

After consideration the Commission finds that public convenience and necessity require the granting of the application. A public hearing is not necessary.

O R D E R

IT IS ORDERED that:

1. A certificate of public convenience and necessity is hereby granted to County Transit Lines, Inc., authorizing the establishment and operation of service as a passenger stage corporation, as that term is defined in Section 226 of the Public Utilities Code, for the transportation of passengers between the points and over the routes set forth in First Revised Page 3, Second Revised Page 4 and Original Page 5 attached hereto, as an extension and enlargement of and consolidation with and subject

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to all the limitations and restrictions set forth in the certificate granted by Decision No. 72023 and in Appendix A attached thereto, as amended by Decision No. 72796 in Application No. 49303.

2. Appendix A of Decision No. 72023, as amended by Decision No. 72796, is further amended by incorporating First Revised Page 3, Second Revised Page 4 and Original Page 5, attached hereto, in revision of Original Page 3 and First Revised Page 4.

3. In providing service pursuant to the certificate herein granted, applicant shall comply with and observe the following service regulations:

- (a) Within thirty days after the effective date hereof, applicant shall file a written acceptance of the certificate herein granted. Applicant is placed on notice that, if it accepts the certificate of public convenience and necessity herein granted, it will be required, among other things, to comply with and observe the safety rules of the California Highway Patrol, the rules and other regulations of the Commission's General Order No. 98-A and insurance requirements of the Commission's General Order No. 101-B. Failure to comply with and observe the safety rules, or the provisions of General Orders Nos. 98-A or 101-B, may result in a cancellation of the operating authority granted by this decision.
- (b) Within one hundred twenty days after the effective date hereof, applicant shall establish the service herein authorized and file tariffs and timetables, in triplicate, in the Commission's office.
- (c) The tariff and timetable filings shall be made effective not earlier than ten days after the effective date of this order on not less than ten days' notice to the Commission and the public, and the effective date of the tariff and timetable filings shall be concurrent with the establishment of the service herein authorized.

SECTION 2. Route DescriptionsRoute No. 1 - Walnut Creek - Concord via Ygnacio Valley

Commencing at the intersection of Civic Drive and N. Broadway, in the City of Walnut Creek; thence via N. Broadway, S. Broadway, Broadway Plaza, S. Main Street, N. Main Street, Civic Drive, Ygnacio Valley Road, San Carlos Drive, Las Lomas Way, Walnut Ave., Wiget Lane, Arbolado Drive, Naranja Drive, Cedro Lane, Oak Grove Road, Meadow Lane, Market Street, Park & Shop Drive, Mira Vista Terrace, Salvio Street, Galindo Street, and Concord Blvd. to its intersection with Grant Street. Also, from the intersection of Ygnacio Valley Road and Civic Drive; thence along Ygnacio Valley Road and N. Main Street to its intersection with Civic Drive. Also, from the intersection of Ygnacio Valley Road and San Carlos Drive; thence along Ygnacio Valley Road, Bancroft Road, and Treat Blvd. to its intersection with Oak Grove Road. Also, from the intersection of Treat Blvd., Geary Road, and Buskirk Ave.; thence along Treat Blvd. to its intersection with Oak Grove Road. Also, from the intersection of Oak Grove Road and Ygnacio Valley Road; thence along Ygnacio Valley Road to its intersection with Clayton Road in the City of Concord.

Route No. 2 - Walnut Creek - Concord via Pleasant Hill

Commencing at the intersection of Lacassie Ave. and Locust Street in the City of Walnut Creek; thence via Locust Street, Civic Drive, N. Broadway, S. Broadway, Broadway Plaza, S. Main Street, N. Main Street, Lacassie Ave., N. California Blvd., Ygnacio Valley Road, Hillside Ave., Parkside Drive, Buena Vista Ave., San Luis Road, Larkey Lane, Geary Road, Putnam Blvd., Patterson Blvd., Boyd Road, Contra Costa Blvd., Gregory Lane, Pleasant Hill Road, Mercury Way, Apollo Way, Taylor Blvd., Morello Ave., Viking Drive, Road through Diablo Valley College Campus (no name), Golf Club Road, Contra Costa Blvd., Sun Valley Drive, Willow Pass Road, Market Street, Park & Shop Drive, Mira Vista Terrace, Salvio Street, Galindo Street, and Concord Blvd. to its intersection with Grant Street. Also, from the intersection of Putnam Blvd., Patterson Blvd., and Oak Park Blvd.; thence along Oak Park Blvd. to its intersection with Buskirk Ave. in the City of Pleasant Hill.

Route No. 3 - Danville - Walnut Creek - Martinez

Commencing at the intersection of Diablo Street and Harz Ave. in Danville; thence along Diablo Street, Front Street Prospect Ave., Harz Ave., Danville Blvd., S. Main Street, Mt. Diablo Blvd., S. Broadway, Broadway Plaza, S. Main Street, N. Main Street, Geary Road, Buskirk Ave., Mayhew Road, Shaw Road, Buskirk Ave., Contra Costa Center Drive, Buskirk Ave., Monument Blvd., Contra Costa Blvd., Pacheco Blvd., Jones Street, Pine Street, Main Street, Berreliessa Street, Alhambra Ave., Arnold Industrial Highway (Calif. State No. 4), Muir Station Road to Veterans Hospital Entrance and return to Arnold Industrial Highway (Calif. State No. 4), in the City of Martinez; thence along Arnold Industrial Highway (Calif. State No. 4) to its intersection with Pacheco Blvd. Also, from the intersection of Pacheco Blvd. and Brown Street in the City of Martinez; thence via Brown Street, Berreliessa Street, and Alhambra Ave. to its intersection with Main Street. Also, from the intersection of Contra Costa Blvd. and Willow Pass Road in the City of Concord; thence along Willow Pass Road, Colfax Street, and Concord Blvd. to its intersection with Grant Street. Also, from the intersection of Monument Blvd. and Calif. State No. 21 in the City of Pleasant Hill; thence along Calif. State No. 21, and Calif. State No. 224, to its intersection with Willow Pass Road in the City of Concord.

Route No. 4 - Concord Area

Commencing at the intersection of Grant Street and Concord Blvd., in the City of Concord; thence along Concord Blvd., Colfax Street, Clayton Road, Washington Blvd., Michigan Blvd., El Camino Drive, Clayton Road, East Street, and Concord Blvd. to its intersection with Grant Street. Also, from the intersection of Grant Street and Concord Blvd.; thence along Concord Blvd., East Street, Willow Pass Road, Landana Drive, Concord Blvd., Thornwood Drive, Wilson Lane, West Street, Concord Blvd., Landana Drive, Willow Pass Road, East Street, and Concord Blvd. to its intersection with Grant Street.
