OPINION

Decision No. 72622, dated June 20, 1967 in the aboveentitled matter, found that respondent charged less than the lawfully prescribed minimum rate for certain transportation resulting in undercharges in the amount of \$3,866.23. Said decision ordered respondent to collect said undercharges and to pay a fine in the amount of the undercharges.

On July 21, 1967, respondent filed a Petition For Abatement Of Fine Imposed By Decision No. 72622. Respondent alleges that he has only \$350 cash, all of which is required to continue operations. Respondent is presently operating two leased trucks and the revenues are barely sufficient to meet operating costs. Respondent further alleges he is diligently attempting to collect the undercharges but as of July 18, 1967 not a single dollar had been recovered.

It is apparent that respondent is not at this time financially able to pay the fine imposed by Decision No. 72622; however, it is also apparent that when respondent collects the undercharges he will be able to apply the collections toward payment of the fine imposed.

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2. In all other respects Decision No. 72622 shall remain in full force and effect.

The Secretary of the Commission is directed to cause personal service of this order to be made upon respondent.
