In the Matter of the Application of SOUTHERN PACIFIC COMPANY for an order authorizing the construction at grade of industrial drill and spur tracks across Vernon Street in the City of Anaheim, County of Orange, State of California.

ORDER

Southern Pacific Company is hereby authorized to construct a drill and a spur track at grade across Vernon Street in the City of Anaheim, Orange County, at the location described in the application, to be identified as Crossing No. BM-513.18-C. Applicant shall bear entire construction and maintenance expense. Construction of said crossing shall be equal or superior to Standard No. 2 of General Order No. 72 and of a width of 40 feet with tops of rails flush with the roadway and with grades of approach not exceeding one percent. Protection shall be by two Standard No. 8 flashing light signals (General Order No. 75-B).

Within thirty days after completion pursuant to this order, applicant shall so advise the Commission in writing. This authorization shall expire if not exercised within one year unless time be extended or if above conditions are not complied with.

Authorization may be revoked or modified if public convenience, necessity, or safety so require.

The effective date of this order shall be twenty days after the date hereof.
