ORDER DISCONTINUING INVESTIGATION

By an order of suspension and investigation, issued April 4, 1967, certain tariff sheets filed under Advice Letter No. 9496 by The Pacific Telephone and Telegraph Company (Pacific) were suspended until August 13, 1967, pending public bearing and further order of the Commission.

By letter dated May 25, 1967, Forestbill Telephone Co., Inc., (Forestbill) stated in essence that it would withdraw its protest of March 20, 1967 to Pacific's filing if its understanding that Pacific would make a new filing deleting certain territory lying within the Forestbill Ranger District of the Tahoe National Forest was correct.

By Decision No. 72840 dated August 1, 1967 the operation end effectiveness of the tariff sheets filed by Pacific's Advice Letter No. 9496 were suspended, for an additional period of six months to and including February 13, 1968, unless otherwise ordered.

On August 9, 1967, Pacific did make a new filing regarding revision of its Georgetown exchange.

By letter dated August 31, 1967, Foresthill stated it had no objection to Pacific's new filing and that its objection to Pacific's previous proposal has been eliminated in the present proposal.
