BEFORE THE PUBLIC UTILITIES COMMISSION OF THE STATE OF CALIFORNIA

In the Matter of the Application of M AND M TRANSFER COMPANY, a California corporation, for suspension of certificated rights as a highway common carrier as to certain commodities between certain points.

Application No. 49380 (Filed May 18, 1967)

OPINION

M and M Transfer Company, presently rendering service as a highway common carrier, requests authority to suspend service for the transportation of certain additional aluminum commodities between Reynolds Metals Company, located in Torrance, California, and destinations in applicant's certificated area in Southern California until June 1, 1968.

It is alleged that said Reynolds Metals Company has embarked upon local shipments of these additional aluminum commodities from its Torrance facility which formerly were shipped out of other facilities via other carriers. Applicant will transport these shipments as a permitted carrier. Applicant further alleges that it does not service any other customers as to the within commodities, and therefore the granting of the application will not have any general effect upon its other business or other competing truckers.

After consideration the Commission finds that the proposed suspension would not be adverse to the public interest and that public convenience and necessity do not require continuance of highway common carrier service by applicant for the commodities listed

in the order herein. A public hearing is not necessary. The Commission concludes that the application herein should be granted.

ORDER

IT IS ORDERED that:

1. Commencing with the effective date of the tariff filings authorized in ordering paragraph 2 hereof and concluding with June 1, 1968, M and M Transfer Company may suspend service as a highway common carrier on shipments of the following commodities between Reynolds Metals Company, located at 2315 Dominguez Avenue, Torrance, California, and destinations in Southern California:

After the effective date hereof and on not less than five days' notice to the Commission and the public applicant shall amend its tariff presently on file with this Commission to reflect the authority herein granted,

The effective date of this order shall be ten days after the date hereof.
