ORDER OF DISMISSAL

The above complaint alleges that on September 11, 1967 Leisure World Bus Co. ceased, and County Transit Lines commenced, bus service from Rossmoor Shopping Center to Walnut Creek "without any known authority" from the Commission; and that County Transit Lines has collected fares of 30 cents "without any known published tariff of such charges."

Complainant alleges that if the defendants have entered into a joint arrangement of such service, then he has been denied the use of a commute ticket issued by Leisure World Bus Co. The only relief sought by complainant is that he "be awarded refund in the difference in the lawful published tariff rates for the 30¢ fare I have had to pay since September 11, 1967, and that the 10 rides left on commute ticket no. 195 be honored retroactively for all such fares paid."

By letter of September 29, 1967, hereby made a part of the record, complainant advised that Leisure World "did reimburse me for the monies I had spent for services which should have been covered by the commute ticket. So the commute ticket reimbursement matter is concluded. The only matter left now is that of the unauthorized operation of County Transit Lines, Inc., and the unauthorized cessation of service by Leisure World Bus Co. Your prompt action in this matter will be appreciated."

The Commission may take official notice of its decisions. Decision No. 72796 in App. No. 49303, issued July 25, 1967, authorized Leisure World Foundation to transfer operative rights to County Transit Lines, Inc., and authorized the latter to establish a one-way adult fare of 30 cents, and a round-trip adult fare of 60 cents.

The Commission's procedural rules require that a complaint set forth the specific act complained of and the exact relief which is desired. The only specific relief sought by complainant having been satisfied by reimbursement for monies spent which should have been: covered by the commute ticket, Case No. 8687 is dismissed.
