ORDER REVOKING WAREHOUSE OPERATIVE RIGHT

Continental Grain Company, a corporation, possesses a prescriptive operative right as a public utility warehouseman for the operation of storage or warehouse floor space at Lemoore, Stockton and Bakersfield and vicinity.

D. G. Harris of Continental Grain Company informed the Commission by letter that the company no longer operates as a grain warehouse at its facility in Stockton and requests that the operative right relating to the Stockton facility be revoked.

In the circumstances, it appears, and the Commission finds, that revocation of the operative right, as requested, would not be adverse to the public interest. A public hearing is not necessary. The Commission concludes that: (1) the operative right should be revoked; (2) a certificate should be granted to Continental Grain Company to cover the remaining warehouse operations currently conducted by the warehouseman; and (3) the tariff applicable to services performed at Stockton should be canceled.

IT IS ORDERED that:

1. The prescriptive operative right as a public utility warehouseman possessed by Continental Grain Company, a corporation, as determined by order dated August 23, 1960, in Case No. 6864, is


hereby revoked and, in place and stead thereof, a certificate of public convenience and necessity is granted to Continental Grain Company, a corporation, as a public utility warehouseman, as defined in Section 239(b) of the Public Utilities Code, for the operation of storage or warehouse floor space as set forth in Appendix A attached hereto and made a part hereof.


2. Continental Grain Co. Warehouse Tariff No. 3, Cal.P.U.C. No. 3, is hereby canceled.




This order shall become effective twenty days after the date hereof.

Lemoore	33,600 square feet plus 27 bulk storage bins.
