OPINION AND ORDER

By this application, Western Motor Tariff Bureau, Inc., seeks authority, on behalf of Western Gillette, Inc. (Western Gillette), to cancel from one of its tariffs certain rail competitive rates for the transportation of soap and related articles from and to various points.

Applicant alleges that Western Gillette has made a study of the rates in question and has found that such rates are non-compensatory. Applicant avers that the one soap company for which Western Gillette occasionally transports a shipment under the involved rates is aware of the carrier's proposal and has informed the carrier that it would not protest the proposed cancellation of rates.

Applicant states that increases resulting from the proposal herein would not increase the California intrastate gross revenue of Western Gillette by as much as one percent.

The rates are set forth in Items Nos. 2100 through 2122, 2565 and 3406 of Western Motor Tariff Bureau, Inc., Agent, Local, Joint and Proportional Freight and Express Tariff No. 109, Cal.P.U.C. No. 3.

the application should be granted.

IT IS ORDERED that:

- 1. Western Motor Tariff Bureau, Inc., is hereby authorized to cancel rates published on behalf of Western Gillette, Inc., as proposed in the application.
- 2. Tariff publications authorized to be made as a result of the order herein shall be filed not earlier than the effective date of this order and may be made effective not earlier than thirty days after the effective date of this order on not less than thirty days' notice to the Commission and to the public.

3. The authority herein granted shall expire unless exercised within ninety days after the effective date of this order.

This order shall become effective twenty days after the date hereof.
