SUPPLEMENTAL OPINION AND ORDER

Las Vegas Service Freightways (formerly Osbourn Trucking Company), a corporation, is a petroleum irregular route carrier operating under a certificate of public convenience and necessity issued by this Commission. On August 17, 1967, the carrier filed its amended articles of incorporation with this Commission changing its corporate name to Wheeler Freightways. Accordingly, its certificate will be amended to show the new corporate name and it will be ordered to amend its tariffs pursuant to General Order No. 80-A. A public hearing is not necessary.

Good cause appearing,

IT IS ORDERED that:

1. Decision No. 60855 dated October 11, 1960, in Application No. 35781 is amended by substituting "Wheeler Freightways" in place and stead of "Las Vegas Service Freightways."

2. Within one hundred twenty days after the effective date hereof, and on not less than ten days' notice to the Commission

and to the public, Wheeler Freightways, a corporation, shall amend its tariffs on file with this Commission as required by Rule No. 6.4 of General Order No. 80-A.

3. The Secretary is directed to cause service of a certified copy of this order to be made upon Wheeler Freightways, or to mail a certified copy thereof to it at its last known address as shown in the Commission's records and to mail a copy of this order to Western Motor Tariff Bureau, Inc., Agent.

This order shall become effective twenty days after the date hereof.
