ORDER EXTENDING TIME

By Decision No. 71992, dated February 7, 1967, in Application No. 48940, the Commission suspended the prescriptive right of San Francisco Warehouse Company until February 1, 1968. It is alleged that applicant has not yet been able to find suitable space in Emeryville in which to resume operations and therefore requests that the suspension be extended to February 1, 1969.

Therefore, good cause appearing,
IT IS ORDERED that:

1. The prescriptive right of San Francisco Warehouse Company to operate as a public utility warehouseman as determined by Commission order dated July 12, 1960, is hereby suspended to and including February 1, 1969.

2. On not less than ten days' notice to the Commission and the public applicant shall amend its tariffs presently on file with the Commission to reflect the authority herein granted.

The effective date of this order shall be the date hereof.
