OPINION AND ORDER

By Decision No. 71922, dated January 24, 1967, in Application No. 49038, the Commission suspended until February 15, 1968, the following public utility warchouse certificates of Signal Trucking Service, Ltd.:

1. Warehouse located at 1500 West Eighth Street, Long Beach, operated pursuant to the authority granted to Signal by Decision No. 53787 (Application No. 37761) and Decision No. 57155 (Application No. 40013).

2. Warehouse located at 314 North Marine Avenue, Wilmington, operated pursuant to the authority granted to Signal by Decision No. 44148 (Application No. 30947) as amended by Decisions Nos. 53580 and 53621. The instant application alleges that Signal has made strenuous efforts to procure warehouse properties in the above cities at a fair rental rate, but has not as yet been able to locate such properties. The application states that Signal believes it has located suitable properties and is presently negotiating rental agreements. In this application, Signal requests suspension of the warehouse operative rights for an additional year.

Therefore, good cause appearing, IT IS ORDERED that:

1. The certificates of Signal Trucking Service, Ltd. to operate as a public utility warehouseman, as described in the preceding Opinion, are hereby suspended to February 15, 1969.

2. On not less than five days' notice to the Commission and the public applicant shall amend its tariffs presently on file with the Commission to reflect the authority herein granted.

The effective date of this order shall be ten days after the date hereof.
