O R D E R

The Southern Pacific Company is hereby authorized to construct a spur track at grade across Colton Avenue in San Bernardino County, at the location described in the application, to be identified as Crossing No. BP-550.6. Construction of said crossing shall be equal or superior to Standard No. 2 of General Order No. 72, without superelevation and of a width to conform to the portion of the avenue now graded, with tops of rails flush with the roadway and with grades of approach not exceeding three percent. Protection shall be by one additional Standard No. 1 crossing sign (General Order No. 75-B) reflectorized with reflex-reflective sheet material. Applicant shall bear entire construction and maintenance expense.

Within thirty days after completion pursuant to this order, applicant shall so advise the Commission in writing. This authorization shall expire if not exercised within one year unless time be extended or if above conditions are not complied with.

Authorization may be revoked or modified if public convenience, necessity, or safety so require.

Applicant alleges that the industry to be served by the spur requires immediate service to avoid expensive delay in the operation of its warehouse.

The effective date of this order shall be the date hereof.
