OPINION AND ORDER

Shifflet Bros., Inc., a corporation, holds radial highway common carrier, highway contract carrier and city carrier permits.¹ By Decision No. 72087 dated February 28, 1967, as amended by Decision No. 73673 dated January 30, 1968, in Application No. 48169, it was authorized to assess rates less than the applicable minimum rates for the transportation of paddy rice, in bulk, from various rice driers in the Sacramento Valley to the processing plant of Rice Growers Association of California at Biggs. The current authority is scheduled to expire with March 1, 1968.

By this application, authority is sought to continue the deviation from the established minimum rates for a further one-year period. Applicant also requests that the authority be extended to include the points of District 10 Rice Drier and HI & Dry Drier.

¹Applicant also possesses a certificate to operate as a cement carrier for the transportation of cement to and within Butte and Sutter Counties from any and all points of origin.

Applicant states that the conditions which justified the granting of the current authority still exist and that such rates are fully compensatory. According to applicant, a study of its records has revealed that, during the past year, transportation conditions at District 10 Rice Drier and HI & Dry Drier have developed characteristics identical with those which justified the reduced rates at presently authorized points and, for this reason, it requests that the authority be extended to include service to the above-named points.

Revenue and expense data furnished by applicant indicate that the transportation involved has been profitable and reasonably may be expected to be profitable during the ensuing year.

The certificate of service shows that a copy of the application was mailed to California Trucking Association on January 31, 1968. The application was listed on the Commission's Daily Calendar of February 5, 1968. No objection to the granting of the application has been received.

In the circumstances, it appears, and the Commission finds, that the proposed rates are reasonable for the transportation involved. A public hearing is not necessary. The Commission concludes that the application should be granted.

In view of the impending expiration date of the current authority, the order which follows will be made effective March 1, 1968.

IT IS ORDERED that:


1. Shifflet Bros., Inc., a corporation, is hereby authorized to transport paddy rice, in bulk, for Rice Growers Association of California at rates less than the established minimum rates but

not less than those set forth in, and subject to the provisions specified in, Appendix A attached hereto and by this reference made a part hereof.

2. The authority herein granted shall, on and after March 1, 1968, supersede the authority granted by Decision No. 72087, as amended by Decision No. 73673, and shall expire with March 1, 1969.

The effective date of this order shall be March 1, 1968.

Section 1.

Item 10 - Application of Rates

The minimum rates and rules set forth in Minimum Rate
Tariff No. 2 are applicable on all shipments of paddy rice,
except as specifically provided in Section 2.

Section 2.

Item 20 - Application

Rates in this section are subject to a minimum weight of
48,000 pounds per shipment and apply only to the transportation
of paddy rice, in bulk, from the points named in Item 30 to the
plant of Rice Growers Association of California at Biggs.
