SUPPLEMENTAL ORDER

Decision No. 73755 dated February 20, 1968, among other things, authorized the County of Los Angeles and the City of Culver City to construct Exposition Boulevard (westbound) at grade across the Santa Monica Branch Line of the Southern Pacific Company to be identified as Crossing No. 6A-10.49 with protection to be by two Standard No. 8 flashing light signals (General Order No. 75-B) and one automatic crossing gate with the provision that backlights may be omitted from these signals.

The County of Los Angeles by Amendment filed January 24, 1968 to Application No. 49260, for reasons stated therein, requests an order authorizing the above crossing to be used for both eastbound and westbound traffic until the City of Los Angeles opens its proposed Jefferson Boulevard (Crossing No. 6A-10.27) authorized by Decision No. 69818, dated October 19, 1965, in Application No. 46319 with time extended to October 19, 1968.

The Southern Pacific Company by letter dated March 11, 1968 has indicated its concurrence in this request provided that protection be afforded by temporary installation of an automatic gate on the south side of the branch track to protect eastbound auto traffic.






It appears that the request is reasonable. IT IS ORDERED that Decision No. 73755 is hereby modified to allow for the temporary use of Exposition Boulevard (Crossing No. 6A-10.49) for two way traffic with protection by two Standard No. 8 flashing light signals (General Order No. 75-B) supplemented with automatic crossing gates. The installation cost of the additional automatic crossing protection shall be borne in accordance with an agreement entered into between the parties. Maintenance cost of the additional crossing protection shall be borne entirely by the City of Culver City pursuant to the provisions of Section 1202.2 of the Public Utilities Code. Permission granted herein is for one year or until Jefferson Boulevard (Crossing No. 6A-10.27) is completed and opened to vehicular traffic.

In all other respects, Decision No. 73755 shall remain in full force and effect.

The applicant desires to open this crossing to traffic as soon as possible.

The effective date of this order shall be the date hereof.
