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| Application of the County of Santa Clara State of California, for an order author- izing widening of an existing overcrossing over the tracks of the Southern Pacific Company in connection with the Improvement of Capitol Expressway in Santa Clara County. |))))) | Application No. 49921 (Filed January 3, 1968) |
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O R D E R

County of Santa Clara is hereby authorized to widen the crossing at separated grades of Capitol Expressway over the tracks of Southern Pacific Company, in San Jose, Santa Clara County, at the location and substantially as shown by plans (Exhibit B) attached to the application, to be identified as Crossing No. E-56.1-A. Construction and maintenance expense shall be borne in accordance with an agreement to be entered into between the parties relative thereto, and copy of said agreement, together with plans of said crossing approved by Southern Pacific Company, shall be filed with the Commission within 180 days from the date hereof. Should the parties fail to agree, the Commission will apportion the cost of construction and maintenance by further order. Clearances shall conform to the provisions of General Order No. 26-D.

By Decision No. 67854, dated September 15, 1964, in Application No. 44697 the Commission authorized the City of San Jose to construct Hillside Expressway at separated grades over the tracks of Southern Pacific Company, inadvertently identifying the separation as Crossing No. E-52.2-A instead of the correct Crossing No. E-56.1-A. Subsequent to the filing of Application No. 44697 by the City of San Jose, the Hillside Expressway has been renamed Capitol Expressway and its jurisdiction relinquished to the County of Santa Clara. The crossing number and expressway name are hereby corrected.

The grade separation project of Capitol Expressway has been established as priority No. 13 on 1968 list by Decision No. 73511 in Case No. 8664 pursuant to Statutes 1957, Chapter 2091, amended Statutes 1959, Chapter 1763.

Within thirty days after completion pursuant to this order applicant shall so advise the Commission in writing. This authorization shall expire if not exercised within three years unless time be extended or if conditions are not complied with. The effective date of this order shall be twenty days after the date hereof.
