Somis Rock Products, Inc., petitioner, seeks the amendment of Minimum Rate Tariff 17 (MRT 17) and Southern California Production Area and Delivery Zone Directory 1, to establish in the latter tariff the description of a new production facility located in Ventura County, and to establish in MRT 17 rates on rock, sand and gravel from said production area to specified delivery zones in Santa Barbara, Ventura and Los Angeles Counties.

The petition alleges the following: Petitioner now, and for several years past, has engaged in the processing and marketing of rock, sand and gravel. Minimum zone rates are not now available from its production facility located approximately 8 miles northwest of Moorpark. The only available rates are the distance and hourly rates set forth in Minimum Rate Tariff No. 7 (MRT 7). Said distance and hourly rates, in general, produce higher aggregate charges than the charges under the zone rates in MRT 17 for the same transportation. The establishment of zone rates from petitioner's production facility would eliminate rate discrimination in favor of competing

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producers of rock aggregates who now have zone rates available from their production facilities.

The petition states that petitioner's facility is of the same general type and character as facilities maintained by other natural rock aggregate producers for the processing of rock, sand and gravel. Said facility is modern in design and fully automated. A 60-foot permanent truck scale is located on the property of the production facility.

The petition contains a metes and bounds description of the proposed new production area, specifies the delivery zones to which rates are requested, and contains tie-in times and mileages from the proposed production area to the existing traverse network.

Copies of the verified petition were served on interested parties on or about December 18, 1967. The petition was listed on the Commission's Daily Calendar of December 27, 1967. No objection to the granting of the petition has been received.

It is clear that the establishment of zone rates, as proposed in the petition, would provide rates of the same kind and character from petitioner's production facility as those already available from other established competing points of production in the same general area.

In the circumstances, it appears, and the Commission finds, that petitioner's proposal is reasonable, and that the resulting minimum rates will be the just, reasonable and nondiscriminatory minimum rates for the transportation of rock, sand and aggregates in dump truck equipment from the proposed production area, hereinafter designated as Production Area 56-Q (Ventura County computer map number 50652), to various Ventura, Santa Barbara and Los Angeles County delivery zones, all as described in Directory 1.
